
Meet some Breastfeeding mams:

Open Access Play

Throughout the summer, our team (including 8 of our 20 play volunteers), delivered a 5-week summer holiday play programme offering an amazing 33 sessions across 7 different locations, including a new site in Cwmtillery! This year we saw over 1000 children joining our sessions with plenty of playful activities on offer including; themed sessions with games; arts & crafts; sand and water play; messy play; the imagination playground; and a range of sports. The play team were also able to provide a range of snacks at each session, including: sandwiches, fresh fruit, cereal bars and bottled water.

All in all, another successful summer of Open Access Play! The Play team would also like to thank Nantyglo & Blaina Town Council for funding sessions at Central Park in Cwmcelyn Blaina.

Play Grant

This year the Play team was incredibly fortunate to be able to offer a Play Grant to local community groups; childcare and play settings; and parent and toddler groups. The grant was designed to provide financial support for initiatives that created enriching and engaging play experiences for children and gave groups/settings a fantastic opportunity to bring innovative ideas to life!





Ebenezer Baptist Church

Ebenezer Baptist Church used their funding to run a summer play day! The team at Ebenezer worked hard to create a safe space for families to enjoy a free play session with their children. Rainy Day Ideas

As the winter comes closer, we know the Welsh weather will be bringing us some rainy days. Keeping the family active during these days can be a challenge but really important to support their health and well-being. Here are some ideas to help you keep your family active during these days:

Indoor activities for you and your family:

- Have a family dance party You can find lots of Just Dance video on Youtube to follow
- Play hide and seek
- Try out some indoor sports with the family
- Come up with an indoor competition with your children
- Stretch with your family there are lots of online tutorials you can follow

Outdoor activities for you and your family:

- Find those muddy puddles and create 'delicious' mud pies together
- Build a den with your little ones and hide from the rain
- Go on an Autumn scavenger hunt look for different coloured leaves; pinecones; acorns or puddles
- Put on your wellies and waterproofs and jump in those puddles!



Autumn Recipe - Chilli Con Carne

Warm up this winter with a healthy chilli con carne—packed with protein, fibre, and bold spices. It's a comforting, nutritious dish that's perfect for cold nights and easy to batch cook for busy weeks.

What you will need:

- > 300g of extra-lean minced beef
- > 1 large onion, chopped finely
- > 2 garlic cloves, chopped finely
- > 400g of tinned chopped tomatoes
- > 2 tablespoons of tomato purée
- > 2 teaspoons of chilli powder (you can add more or less, depending how spicy you want it!)
- > 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- > 1 red pepper, diced
- > 2 handfuls of sliced cup or button mushrooms
- > 410g of red kidney beans, drained (tinned beans are the easiest to use!)
- > 150ml of reduced-salt vegetable or chicken stock
- > 300g of white or brown rice
- > 1 pinch ground black pepper (add to taste)

Method:

- 1. Heat a large saucepan or frying pan and add the minced beef, a handful at a time, cooking it until browned. Then, add the onion and garlic and cook for another 2 to 3 minutes.
- 2. To the pan, add the chopped tomatoes, tomato purée, spices, red pepper, mushrooms, kidney beans and stock.
- 3. Stir well and bring to the boil. After that, lower the heat and simmer gently for 15 to 20 minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, cook the rice according to instructions on the packet.
- 5. Season the chilli with pepper to your own taste and serve with the boiled rice

You can substitute the beef for turkey mince, vegetarian mince or even extra beans! If you like things extra hot, you can add spices like Cayenne Pepper, Paprika or even Chilli Flakes! Chilli Con Carne is also really versatile, you can serve it with baked potatoes, homemade fries or pasta!

Online Safety

Let's talk video games! There are lots of conversations about video games and the pros and cons surrounding them. In this section we are going to explore some of the dangers of three of the most popular games for children and take a look at what you can do to help keep your child as safe as possible when playing these!

Minecraft

- Minecraft can be a scary game for young players. While the characters have a cartoon link appearance, the eerie music and combat can be scary for young player. To avoid the inclusion of 'enemies', you can select the creative or peaceful mode of the game. This gives children the opportunity to build and explore aspects of the game without any combat or the threat of their work being damaged.
- Minecraft has the function to join public servers and interact with strangers. This can obviously come with risks. It can also lead to other people 'griefing'; whereby someone with intentionally destroy another player's builds. To avoid this, players can host their own private server, where they can control who is able to enter and can ban anyone who shouldn't be there. This does, however, cost a monthly fee.

Roblox

- Roblox offers a wide range of parental controls to help support you when keeping your little one safe. To
 help you manage their online experience, you can set age ranges for the people who are able to contact
 the account. You can also close public chat boxes and make profiles private. This can help reduce the
 possibility of strangers contacting your child online. It can also be beneficial to teach your child how to
 block and report other players, this will help them to have a happier experience.
- While Roblox offers a range of parental controls, there is still a range of inappropriate content on the game. You can set parent controls to reduce the risk of your child seeing this, but it is important to be aware of all of the smaller games that contain 18+ content. With younger children, it may be beneficial to play the game together.

Zepeto

Zepto is a little bit different to the other two games. It is a fast-growing app that blend social networking with a game platform. Players can explore a virtual world, play games and interact with strangers.

- Zepeto is aimed at children aged 14+ however, there is no age verification and no parental controls on the app. There is also a wide range of user generated content that may contain themes unsuitable for children. When you download the app, the default setting also allows anyone on the app to message the account. To combat some of the concerns, you can change the privacy settings to limit who can message the account but there are no controls to limit the content. You should encourage your children to be open with the content they are seeing on the app and monitor what they might be exposed to.
- Another concern with Zepeto is the addictiveness of the app and the ability to spend real money! On both Android and Apple, you can set restrictions for daily screen time on apps. This can help children manage their time on the app. You can also add a purchase approval system to ensure your little ones are not spending any money they shouldn't be on the apps.

Launched in April this year, Pathways programme is already making a meaningful impact. The team has recently expanded with two new staff members, allowing them to support even more participants. Many individuals are embarking on volunteer placements, gaining valuable hands-on experience. Participants are supported every step of the way, with access to fully funded training including Safeguarding, Manual Handling, and First Aid. This initiative is designed to help people build confidence, develop new skills, and ultimately move leaners into paid employment.

The program offers four tailored pathways to suit different interests and career goals: Steps into Childcare, Food & Nutrition Skills, Introduction to Health & Social Care and Employability. Whether you're looking to start a new career, gain practical experience, or simply explore your options, this is a fantastic opportunity to get involved. All of the courses are free and here to support you and your individual needs
